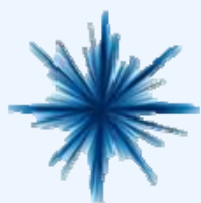

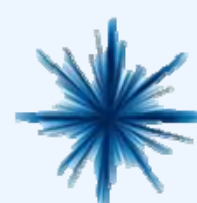
Education Week

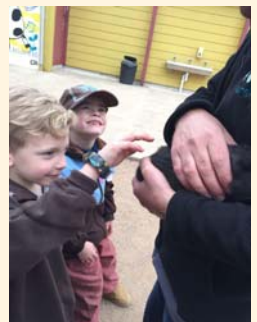

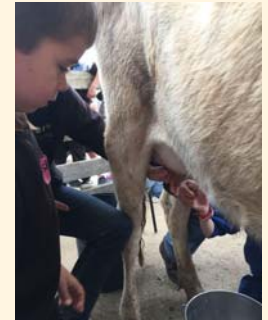

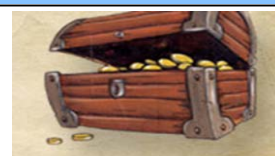
